

## WEYBOURNE AND BEACH RIDE

**Distance:** Around 5 miles.

**PLEASE TAKE CARE TO LOOK AHEAD FOR OBSTACLES WHEN RIDING ON TRAILS - AND ADVISE THOSE WHO ARE BEHIND YOU**

Turn right on to the road out of the cycle hire centre. At the junction turn left. Follow the road around the left hand corner, over the speed bump. Next to the laundry on your left is a small pathway sign posted 'Fishing Pond & North Norfolk Railway'. Turn left and follow the path. Cross straight over the track and continue down the long hill (Please take care and mind out for other users) At the bottom of the hill continue past the pond until you reach the high bank which the railway runs along. Turn right and continue alongside the railway on the pathway until it turns into a small concrete driveway. Bare left and continue the short distance until you reach the road.

Turn left and follow the road over the bridge towards Weybourne (This road can be quite busy and tight in places – please be careful) Follow the road down into the village and round a left hand corner. At the junction turn right and follow the short distance to the junction with the church in front of you. (You are welcome into the church and grounds. Lock your cycles up against the wall to the left of the church wall if you wish to look further – there is a small ruined section of this church to the right)

Otherwise, turn left. Once around the corner you turn right onto Beach Road. (On the right of this junction there is 'The Village Store'. They serve proper ground coffee, tea, food such as take-away pizzas and much more. They are also the home of the locally famous 'Sponge' cakes! A must try for any visitor! Also available in Weybourne village is 'The Ship Inn' public house, serving refreshments and it also has a garden at the rear. 'Bunteas Tearoom' is a little further down Beach Road on your right hand side, serving refreshments. There is also 'Gasches Gallery', heading towards Cley on your left and finally 'The Muckleborough Collection' can be found on the top of the hill heading towards Cley on your right)

Continue down Beach Road until you reach..... The Beach! Please don't take the bikes on the beach or in the sea! You can find various fences to lock your cycles to. To your left and right is the Norfolk Coastal Path which is a lovely way to see our section of coastline on foot. Please be aware the water here is very deep and has extremely strong under currents. In the field to your right as you look towards the beach are 3 old wartime pill boxes which are worth a look.

To return back to Kelling Heath re-trace your route back to the junction with the coast road. Turn left, go around the corner and turn right opposite the church where you came out before. This time, follow the road around to the right onto 'Holt Road' do not turn left. Follow this road around the bends and continue up the steep hill through the woods until the road flattens out with heath land on either side of the road. Continue for 100 metres or so along the flat road until you find a car width track on your left with a public footpath sign pointing down it. Turn left and follow the track keeping right all the way to the white crossing gate at the railway line. Be careful crossing as this is a working line and shut the gates behind you please. Continue straight ahead on the track until you reach the main campsite.

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
